### Deferment Challenge Basics Arbitration Forums, Inc. Membership driven. Innovation focused.



Deferments can be challenged by any party. Once challenged, it will immediately go to hearing where an arbitrator will rule on it. In cases where Jurisdictional Exclusions (JE) are raised with a deferment, the Jurisdictional Exclusion is heard first and a ruling is made.

A deferment challenge ruling has one of two outcomes:

**Deferment Allowed** 

**Deferment Not** Allowed

### Jurisdictional Exclusions



When a Jurisdictional Exclusion (JE) is raised with a deferment and then challenged by a party, the case goes to hearing to resolve the Jurisdictional Exclusion first.

Jurisdictional Exclusion rulings have one of two outcomes:

## Jurisdictional Exclusion Ruling Outcomes



In Jurisdiction

The case is considered **in jurisdiction** and proceeds to hearing again on the Deferment Challenge and ruled on.

**Out of Jurisdiction** 

The case is considered **out of jurisdiction** as lacking jurisdiction and is withdrawn.

### Deferment Challenge Ruling Outcomes



**Deferment Allowed** 

The case will be restored to deferred status for one year from the deferment request date, and the parties will be notified.

No further action is needed until the deferment expires. Once expired, parties may need to **resubmit** a case for it to proceed to hearing.

Deferment Not Allowed

The parties are notified. Parties may be required to **resubmit** a case for it to proceed to hearing. This additional step will depend on how the original case was submitted (Initial or Final Case Submission).

### **Terms & Definitions**



The terms and definitions on this page are intended to help parties distinguish between cases that have an Initial Submission from those with a Final Submission.



An initial submission is when a deferment is **added with or during** the initial case and is requested **prior** to selecting the **Submit** tab .



When a deferment ends, this submission type requires the case to be resubmitted to be viewable by the arbitrator. Parties can simply review case details, amend the case to include new information, or edit information previously entered.

A final submission is when a deferment is added **AFTER** the Submit tab



is selected.




When a deferment ends, this submission type does not allow parties to amend previously entered information into the case. The case and the original information entered remains final and cannot be changed.

### Case Status Options




When a deferment ends, the case status will change. If the status of the case changes to pending/in progress, it must be resubmitted for it to proceed to hearing. If not, no action is required.







### Deferment Challenge Justification



After selecting a Challenge Deferment option, a dialog box will appear. Enter a justification, attach evidence, and select the **Submit Challenge** button.

Once the deferment justification challenge is submitted, a blue banner will appear stating the deferment and challenge will be immediately reviewed by an arbitrator.



**Deferment Challenged:** The deferment and challenge will be reviewed by an arbitrator. You will be notified of their ruling.

An email notification will also be sent.






### Deferment Ruling — Not Allowed ARBITRATION FORUMS, INC. Membership driven. Innovation focused.



Under Findings, the deferment ruling can be found along with the arbitrator justification.



If the deferment is **not allowed** (challenge) successful), it will end, and the case status will change to **Pending**. Parties will complete workflow steps and submit a case to hearing on liability and/or damages.



### Deferment Ruling – Allowed



Under **Findings**, the deferment ruling can be found along with the arbitrator justification.

If the deferment **is allowed** (challenge unsuccessful), the case will be restored to deferred status for one year from the deferment request date, and the parties will be notified.


